1430: Conversation Earth: Today it could be argued that human beings daily act against our own self-interests. How? Biologist Paul Ehrlich and fellow scientists tell us we are expanding our population and economy beyond the Earth's carrying capacity - at our peril. Why do we insist on continuing? Ehrlich has been a keen observer of human behavior for over 50 years, and he thinks we need a millennium assessment of human behavior. If we can understand how we behave, and why we behave that way, perhaps we can figure out how to behave as though we want to hang around another thousand years. Ehrlich is best known for authoring The Population Bomb, published in 1968 at the suggestion of the Sierra Clubs first executive director, David Brower. Pauls wife, Anne Ehrlich, co-authored the book (though the publisher insisted only Pauls name adorn the book). Paul and Anne preferred a different title, Population, Resources and Environment, as the book was about much more than human population. The book offered dramatic warnings about the impact of the expanding scale of the human enterprise, which included not just the number of people on the planet, but also their behavior " levels of consumption and the size of their economies. You'll hear from the late Dr. Vincent Harding, Professor of Religion and Social Transformation at Illiff School of Theology in Denver, Colorado and a personal friend and speech writing colleague of Dr. King in the 1960s. (Dr. Harding died in May of 2014 about 6 months after this interview) Also mixed into our program, you'll hear Dr. Clayborne Carson, who at Coretta Scott King's request, has been directing the King Papers Project since 1985. Dr. Carson established the Martin Luther King, Jr., Research and Education Institute at Stanford University in 2005. The speeches these scholars chose were King's last address, the night before his assassination in Memphis in April, 1968. Also, the speech he made a year to the day before he was killed, called Beyond Vietnam, in which Dr. King came out publicly and explicitly in opposition to the Vietnam War. And from March of 1965, Dr. King's remarks that he made at the conclusion of the Selma to Montgomery marches, considered a turning point in the struggle for Voting Rights and equality for African Americans.
