

KCPK-LP at FM 106.9 on your radio dial

This is schedule from July 10 (Monday) through July 23 (Sunday) with different shows each day. Then same shows repeat for following two weeks. New schedule will be posted for August 7, 2017

We are still in testing stage. If you find that a particular show has been replaced with classical music, this indicates that KCPK has encountered a broadcasting problem. Typically, the problem is resolved by the next hour. We appreciate your comments about problems.

Sign-on at approximately 6:55 a.m.: KCPK is an affiliate of Pacifica Radio Network. KCPK airs programs from all over the U.S. which are produced by affiliates. KCPK plans to offer local programming to the Pacifica Radio network, by uploading locally produced shows and giving our community producers the opportunity to broadcast nationally as well as locally. We conclude our sign-on with our theme song written for our area's historical documentary, "The Coming of Asphalt as told through Rural Storytelling Performance Art. You can view this video at our website under tab Cal Humanities Video. The theme song is entitled "The Road to Take Us Home" and is written and performed by Lily Landers, Kevin Davis, and Murphy Cross. Any programming you may have heard prior to KCPK's sign-on was coming from a large FM station from Bakersfield at FM 107.1 which over-powers our frequency 106.9 before we sign on the air.

7: 00 a.m. Democracy Now: 1 hr. stream from Pacifica (Monday through Friday only)

Democracy Now! is a national, daily, independent, award-winning news program hosted by journalists Amy Goodman and Juan Gonzalez.

8:00 a.m. Conversation Earth: 1 hr. program (two 29 min. segments) (Monday through Friday only)

For the first time in history, the activity of human civilization reaches into every corner of the globe. So significant is the role we play that our time has been dubbed the Anthropocene Epoch. This calls for self-examination at a new level. Conversation Earth presents dialog with the leading thinkers of our time. Philosophy, ethics, science, psychology, and economics, at a macro level, and all focused on humankind's relationship with the planet.

7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Classical Music: (Saturday & Sunday replacement):

2 hr. program (two 1 hr. segments) Various classical musical broadcastings. One show is Baroque and Beyond, a radio show devoted to Baroque and Classical Music ("and a little bit of 'beyond') for Pacifica-affiliated stations. Produced by Michael White, who is a physician in his "day job" and is not a music professional.

9:00 a.m. Politics of Health & Fitness: 1 hr.

Produced by Layna Berman, a health educator and health integration specialist. She brings over twenty years of experience, skill, and knowledge to support people in solving health and health care problems.

10:00 a.m. Book Reviews: 1 hr.

Francesca Rheannon is an independent radio producer and show host of a talk show about writing, writers and their works, that has been on the air since 2004.

11:00 a.m. Food Politics: 1 hr. (two 29 min segments)

The "Root Stock Radio Show" focuses on food, farming, and family. Each show will illuminate and educate listeners about the good food movement—the challenges faced, the change makers and grass root initiatives that provide promising sparks—and provide solid information about what each of us can do to work toward a healthy, sustainable, and just food system.

12:00 p.m. Book Waves: 1 hr. (two 29 min segments)

This is a radio program about books and interviews with their authors. It comes from Berkeley and is hosted by Richard Wolinsky since 2006.

1:00 p.m. Psychology Talks: 1 hr.

MyNDTALK, by psychologist Pamela Brewer, is intended for adults 18 years+ for use as one of the resources utilized in the ongoing acquisition of quality relationship health and mental health information. Listeners are encouraged to research, question, and review all forms of information/education particularly as it pertains to physical/emotional/social/psychological/relationship/mental health.

2:00 p.m. Mayo Clinic Radio: 2 hours composed of three 40-minute segments

This show uses thousands of Mayo clinic experts, state of the art research facilities, and other resources to bring the latest breakthroughs in medical news, research, and healthy living advice.

4:00 p.m. Kids Stories: 1 hr. (two 29 min. segments)

This show is called "Tell us a Tale" which is technically a children's program. However, it appeals to listeners of all ages with its offering of stories and tunes collected from all around the world.

5:00 p.m. Flashpoints: 1 hr. stream from Pacifica (Monday through Friday only)

An award winning front-line investigative news magazine, focusing on human, civil and workers' rights, issues of war and peace, Global Warming, racism and poverty, and other issues. Hosted by Dennis J. Bernstein.

6:00 p.m. Pacifica Evening News: 1 hr. stream from Pacific (Monday through Friday only)

The Pacifica Evening News is a collaboration of KPFA and KPFK in Los Angeles and KFCF in Fresno. Comprehensive coverage of the day's news with a focus on war and peace; social, environmental, and economic justice.

5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Classical Music: (Saturday & Sunday Replacement):

2 hr. program (two 1 hr. segments) Various classical musical broadcastings. One show is Baroque and Beyond, a radio show devoted to Baroque and Classical Music ("and a little bit of 'beyond') for Pacifica-affiliated stations. Produced by Michael White, who is a physician in his "day job" and is not a music professional.

7:00 p.m. Arts Express Radio: 1 hr.

This is a vibrant anthology mix of cultural news, views and interviews, and the organic and intricate ways that art always intertwines and fuses dynamically with political currents of the day. Arts Express provides in-depth coverage of film, arts news and scoops with a hard core political edge, and contemplative voyages through web culture served up with an enticing, multi-cultural international flavor.

8:00 p.m. The Iliad of Homer, Rendered into English Blank Verse: 1 1/2 to 2 hrs.

This is a two week reading of Homer (c. 8th century) translated by Edward Smith-Stanley (Earl of Derby, 1799-1869). The Edinburgh Review stated “The merits of Lord Derby’s translation is eminently attractive; it is instinct with life; it may be read with fervent interest; it is immeasurably nearer than Pope to the text of the original. Lord Derby has given a version far more closely allied to the original, and superior to any that has yet been attempted in the blank verse of our language.” This current reading is produced by “Librivox.org” which is committed to delivering public domain literature. To “read along”, go to their website for the text. The readings will cover 14 days of our broadcasting, then repeat in chapter sequence for the next 14 days.

9:30 p.m. (approx. time) International Music: less than 1 hr.

This show will follow the reading of “The Iliad of Homer,” which lasts from one and a half to two hours each chapter. Dennis Darrah is a 21 year programmer at Goddard College Community radio (wgdr.org) who compiles international music for “tranceformation.”

10:00 p.m. Sign-off:

We conclude our sign-off with our theme song. Any programming you may hear after KCPK’s sign-off is coming from a large FM station from Bakersfield at FM 107.1 which over-powers our frequency 106.9 once we sign off the air.

Occasionally, we remain on air for longer, and you will hear classical music.
